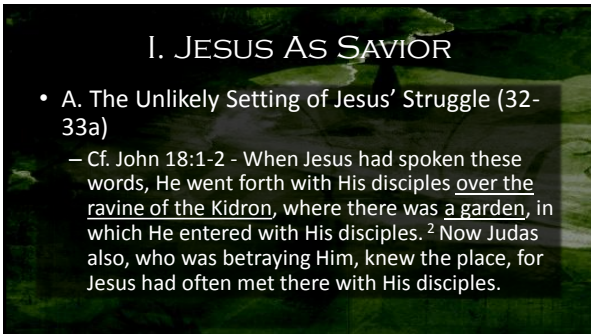
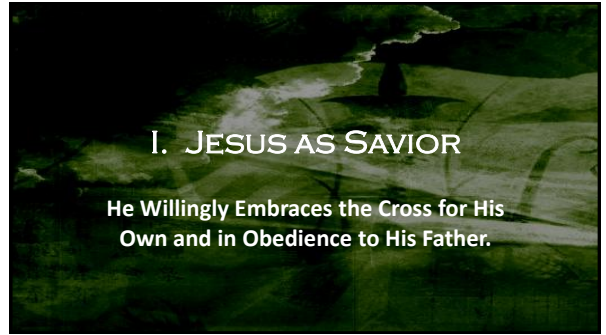

I. JESUS AS SAVIOR

- A. The Unlikely Setting of Jesus' Struggle (32-33a)
 - Cf. Luke 22:39 - And He came out and proceeded as was His custom to the Mount of Olives.
 - Cf. John 18:2 - Judas also, who was betraying Him, knew the place, for Jesus had often met there with His disciples.
- B. The Shocking Description of Jesus' Struggle (33b-36)

THE HEART OF JESUS' PRAYER

- 1) By Mark and Peter: "The Hour" (35)
- 2) By Jesus: "The Cup" (36)

"THE HOUR"

- A predetermined moment, season, or time.
- In John...
 - 1) John 2:4 - the hour to perform a certain sign.
 - 2) John 5:25 - the hour to awaken those spiritually dead.
 - 3) John 5:28 - a future hour in which he will raise all the physically dead.
 - 4) John 13:1 - the hour for Jesus to depart from this world.
 - 5) John 12:23; 17:1 - the hour to be glorified in his death and resurrection.

"THE CUP"

- What will happen during that sovereignly appointed hour.
- What is the cup?
 - 1) Desertion of Jesus by his friends and disciples
 - 2) Physical pain and suffering
 - 3) Physical death
 - 4) The wrath of God.
 - Ps. 75:8; Is. 51:17, 22; Jer. 25:15

I. JESUS AS SAVIOR

- C. Jesus' Profound Concern for His Disciples (37-41a)
- D. Jesus' Renewed Resolve to Drink the Cup (41b-42)
 - “It is enough!”
 - 1) Enough sleep—it's time of the disciples to wake up.
 - 2) Enough time—the hour has come.
 - 3) Enough prayer—the issue about which he prayed is now settled.

LESSONS ABOUT OUR LORD AS SAVIOR...

- 1) Jesus' humanity
- 2) Jesus' perfect obedience
 - Phil. 2:8 - Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
- 3) Jesus' voluntary suffering
 - Heb. 5:5-10
