- 1. Jesus of Nazareth never really existed.
- 2. The simple life of Jesus of Nazareth grew into a legend recorded in the NT.
- 3. The resurrection was a hallucination or delusion.
- 4. Jesus never really died—He went into a coma and eventually revived.
- 5. The witnesses went to the wrong tomb.
- 6. Someone stole Jesus' dead body.
